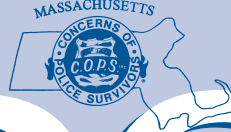

SUE FITZSIMMONS TAKES OVER AS NEW MA COPS PRESIDENT



Susan Fitzsimmons was the wife of Patrolman Joseph T. Fitzsimmons, Jr. of Wellesley. Joe was hit while directing traffic during a snowstorm in November 1978. Shortly after his accident, his fourth daughter Erin was born joining her sisters Leanne, Kimberly, and Meghan. Sue, a former operating room nurse, who dealt with trauma patients everyday now had to deal with raising four girls, all under the age of five, and caring for her injured husband all by herself.

Severely brain damaged from the accident, Sue tried to manage, but within five years, Joe's injuries became even too much for Sue to handle. Joe suffered for 14 years before succumbing to his injuries at the Soldiers Home in Chelsea on April 10, 1992.

Although it took an additional two years before Joe would get his name on the National Law Enforcement Memorial in Washington, DC, it was there that Sue and her teenage daughters first became involved with Concerns of Police Survivors. After the Massachusetts Chapter was formed, Sue became a regular, supporting all new families that were stuck by a tragedy such as her own.

Over the years Sue's family has increased. Since 1990, she has been a foster parent for school aged children and sibling groups and has gone on to adopt three children Melanie now 17, Nicole 14, and Jessica 8. Sue also has two foster children ages 5 and 8 as well as two grandchildren Shannon and Reilly.

Sue is also a mentor for new foster families, a hot-line mother who handles emergency cases and one of the regional representatives for the Mass Alliance for Families – a foster parent association.

Last March, the Boston Celtics recognized Sue as "A Hero Among Us." The award is presented to people who have made exceptional and lasting contributions to their communities. This, however, was something MA COPS already knew. We are so very honored that Sue has chosen to lead the Chapter as President for the 2006 calendar year.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATES

Speak Out for Legislation for Affordable Healthcare for Line-of-Duty Death Widow(er)s

In September of 2004, DC Metropolitan Police Widow Yvette Johnson met with Gary Hankins, a retired DC police officer and former President of DC FOP Lodge #1. She asked why she had to purchase health care coverage at such exorbitant costs when her husband gave his all for the DC Government. Gary was shocked to learn that surviving families are denied access to affordable coverage following the **line-of-duty death** of their law enforcement officer.

Gary Hankins has been known for years as a man who can get things done. He approached the Congressional office of Bart Stupak, D-MI, about the issue since Congressman Stupak is a former Michigan State Trooper. Gary called and then met with DC COPS and National COPS representatives seeking the organization's support for a bill to provide Federal health care coverage to survivors. In January 2004 with the help of Gary Hankins, COPS National President Shirley Gibson and Executive Director Suzie Sawyer met with Lauren Lark of Congressman Stupak's office vowing COPS' support if a bill providing affordable health care coverage for survivors was introduced.

A few months later, the Congressional Budget Office asked for estimated costs for including public safety survivors in the Federal health care plan. Knowing that the Public Safety Officers Benefits Program did not have their computerization of claims paid back to 1976 complete, COPS asked if a one-year compilation of surviving spouses and dependent-aged children would meet the Budget Office's needs. COPS proudly provided that information to Congressman Stupak's office on June 24, 2005, and it was forwarded on to the Congressional Budget Office.

During the week of November 21, 2005, Congressman Bart Stupak sent letters to all members of the House of Representatives asking them to co-sponsor the Widow(er)s' Federal Employees Health Bill. On November 14, COPS sent letters to the 440-seated members of the House of Representatives asking them not only to co-sponsor the bill but also to vote for its passage.

The legislation has now been introduced in the US House of Representatives. Passage of H.R. 4424 would allow law enforcement surviving spouses and dependent children affordable health care coverage by participating in the Federal Employees Health Care Plan. Monthly savings could be as much as 80% of what they are now paying for health care. COPS is requesting law enforcement's help in assuring passage of this legislation. An Act Concerning Benefits for the Survivors of Public Safety Officers Killed in the Line of Duty

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

Section 1. (NEW) (Effective October 1, 2006) Section 12-81 of the general statutes is amended to add a new subsection as follows:

The principal residence of the surviving spouse of a police officer or firefighter who dies while in the performance of such officer's or firefighter's duties.

Sec. 2. (Effective October 1, 2006) Section 12-81x of the general statutes is repealed.

Sec. 3. (Effective October 1, 2006) Subsection (a) of section 7-433b of the general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof:

(a) Notwithstanding the provisions of any general statute, charter or special act to the contrary affecting the noncontributory or contributory retirement systems of any municipality of the state, or any special act providing for a police benefit fund or other retirement system, the survivors of any uniformed or regular member of a paid fire department or any regular member of a paid police department whose death has been suffered in the line of duty shall be eligible to receive such survivor benefits as are provided for in the Workers' Compensation Act, and, in addition, they shall receive such survivor benefits as may be provided for in the retirement system in which such department member was a participant at the time of his or her death; provided such pension benefits (1) shall not terminate on the remarriage of the spouse of such member, and (2) shall be adjusted so that the total weekly benefits received by such survivors shall not exceed one hundred per cent of the weekly compensation being paid, during their compensable period, to members of such department at the maximum rate for [in] the same position which was held by such deceased at the time of his or her death. Nothing contained [herein] in this section shall prevent any town, city or borough from paying money from its general fund to any such survivors, provided total weekly benefits paid shall not exceed said one hundred per cent of the weekly compensation.

Sec. 4. (NEW) (Effective October 1, 2006) Notwithstanding the provisions of the general statutes or any public or special act, the survivors of any officer of the Department of Correction killed in the line of duty shall be eligible to receive such survivor benefits as are provided for in the Workers' Compensation Act, and, in addition, they shall receive such survivor benefits as may be provided for in the retirement system in which such officer was a participant at the time of his or her death, provided such pension benefits (1) shall not terminate on the remarriage of the spouse of such officer, and (2) shall be adjusted so that the total weekly benefits received by such survivors shall not exceed one hundred per cent of the weekly compensation being paid, during their compensable period, to officers of the Department of Correction in at the maximum rate for the same position which was held by such deceased at the time of his or her death.

Sec. 5. (NEW) (Effective October 1, 2006) Notwithstanding the provisions of any general statute, charter or special act affecting the noncontributory or contributory retirement systems of any municipality of the state, or any special act providing for a police benefit fund or other retirement system, the surviving spouse of any uniformed or regular member of a paid fire department or any regular member of a paid state or municipal police department killed in the line of duty shall be eligible to receive such member's base salary at the maximum rate for the position held by such member until the date on which such member would have been eligible to retire from service in the paid fire department or paid police department, as the case may be, provided such salary shall be reduced by the amount of any workers' compensation benefits payable to such surviving spouse. On and after such date, the surviving spouse of such member shall be eligible to receive the benefits such member would have been entitled to receive and as are provided for in the retirement system in which such member was a participant at the time of his or her death.

Statement of Purpose:

To recognize the sacrifice of public safety officers killed in the line of duty.
